## PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION WITH KIMLEY-HORN AND ASSOCIATES, LLC REGARDING STREET AND UTILITY MAINTENANCE PROGRAM.

Barry Sullivan, City Manager, discussed infrastructure failures dating back to 2009 that resulted in the development of the Street and Utility Maintenance Program in 2010 to prioritize solutions for the City. Infrastructure failures were caused by numerous water/ sewer breaks, outdated pipes up to 80 years old, and the lack of a drainage system. The program benefits included completion of high impact projects, clear direction for public services staff, and consistent communication. With the plan being 10 years old, a new plan is needed to incorporate better technology, new priorities, and updated costs.

Colton Hermes, Kimley-Horn Representative, gave a presentation of the use of Roadbotics, a new method of grading streets to prioritize improvements within the city. The benefits of using Roadbotics would save time and money, as it is tied to a work order program and keeps track of work history. It will also have a consistent and quick grading of streets to prioritize projects to improve the City.
